


I have 150 students working on 34 projects in groups, the first of which finished a few minutes ago, in Christchurch. Their actions range from repainting schools, organizing charity quiz nights, to baking cupcakes to give away as random acts of kindness. All projects complet by October 7th, 2012

Why Service Projects?

Christchurch needs a lot of work done. 70% of the central city has been, or will be demolished. The rebuild is a 15-20 year process, leaving much vacant space and countless opportunities.





The city has a river running through the centre and out into the eastern suburbs. Along the river, 6,800 private homes are being demolished

Why Service Projects?

Our team from the Student Volunteer army has been embarrasingly well recognised and thanked for our leadership initiative through the 5 Christchurch Earthquake response periods. The amount we learned is indescribable, and we see value in pressing more people through through this experiential learning process.
