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



# The Foundation piece

#### The Children's Charter on DRR (2011)

- 1. Schools must be safe and education must not be interrupted
- 2. Child protection must be a priority before, during and after a disaster
- 3. Children have the right to participate and to access the information they need
- 4. Community infrastructure must be safe, and relief and reconstruction must help reduce future risk
- 5. Disaster Risk Reduction must reach the most vulnerable people

## Grissing Budget Scenarios

Indicators only (Est. \$10,000 USD)

Analysis of 100-200 Action Plans; Formal consultation process; Continuous review; Media & PR launch; Ongoing negotiation etc.

Indicators + Best Practice Guide (Est. \$30,000 USD)

Printing and distribution; In-depth analysis of 200-400 action plans; Formation of a management committee; Interactive website etc.

**Indicators + Best Practice Guide + Youth Forum** (Est. \$100,000 USD)

Venue, catering and logistics supporting up to 100 youth delegates; Accommodation and expenses incurred for guest speakers etc.



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
