### I. Rationale

In line with the program of the Department of Peace Studies, "Andurog sa Tuninong", the group choose this topic because eradicating poverty also means to eradicating structural violence and less conflicts.

One of the root causes of poverty is Lack of Job Opportunities due to Lack of Education. In connection with this, the Department of Peace Studies will be spearheading an event that aims to educate and train out-of-school-youth to equip them and provide them with various job opportunities through partnership with other institutions such as DSWD, DOLE, DTI, and TESDA.
