Through this campaign, we want to highlight the value of being involved with socially-relevant activities and issues in our own communities.


### To achieve this, the team came up with two approaches:







I returned to Myanmar in 1988 to take care of my ailing mother but the repressive actions of the military regime that year pushed me to lead the peaceful fight towards democracy. Despite winning the 1990 elections, I was detained and spent most of the past two decades in house arrest. But that didn't stop me in serving my country. After being released from detention two years ago, I decided to run for a parliament seat this year and won by a landslide.




when was 20




# WhenlWas20 Seminar Series (Offline Component)

Furthermore, members of the WhenIWas20 team have been invited to various international seminars and forums to share their advocacies and the WhenIWas20 campaign.


