ACTION PLAN: Building Peace by Creating Awareness on Arsenic Contamination

Problem Statement

 Almost 75 million people of Bangladesh are at risk of getting affected with arsenic contamination. Proper steps should be taken in real time.

What is arsenic contamination?

 Arsenic contamination of groundwater is often due to naturally occurring high concentrations of arsenic in deeper levels of groundwater. It is a high-profile problem due to the use of deep tubewells for water supply in the Ganges delta, causing serious arsenic poisoning to large numbers of people. Affected countries include Argentina, Bangladesh, Chile, Nepal, USA, Thailand, Vietna m and many more.

The effect of arsenic consumption

Consuming water contaminated by arsenic can cause skin and bladder cancer, as well as cardiovascular disease its already causing death of a great number of people.

Targeted People's

 People living in the rural area's of Bangladesh generally fell victim to arsenic contamination. They are the primary concern of this action plan.

Challenges

- Lack of co-operation from local authorities: The action plan will be implemented in distant parts of Bangladesh. So the co-operation and permission of the local authorities is a vital factor.
- Getting adequate funding: The success of the action plan depends on getting adequate funds. So a lot of measures have to be taken to get enough funds.

Programs

- 1) Workshops and Counseling: To teach people about the severe effect of using arsenic contaminated ground water and measures to avoid these problems by finding alternative source of fresh drinking water.
- 2) Field Work: Taking youth to the affected area's and engaging them in voluntary work.

How it will be done?

- Workshops and counseling will be held in different educational institutions in the affected areas. In this process the elders as well as the students will learn about arsenic contamination.
- Volunteers principally students will be selected to participate in the field works.
 They will also color arsenic affected tubewells with red paints to warn the people.

Goals

 The goal is to make people aware about the consequences of arsenic consumption.

 Involving youths in community service and volunteerism.

Indicator

 The success indicator relies on how many people are getting benefitted with this action plan.

 The development of the perception of youths towards volunteerism is another success indicator.
