

Problem Statement

- According to the Department of Labor and Employment, the Philippines is home to two million working Filipino children aged 5-17 as of 2013.¹
- As of 2012, more than a million of them were not attending school. Children as young as 5 leave school to engage in some form of labor. We encounter some of them along the streets.²
- Children miss out on basic classes such as hygiene, sanitation, health, and nutrition.³
- The UN Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (UNESCAP) stressed that these lessons are "critical for laying the foundation for children's subsequent learning and development."³

IMPORTANCE OF PLAY

- Playing is a significant part to child development that it has been recognized by the United Nations High Commission for Human Rights as a right of every child. However, it is being challenged by forces including child labor and exploitation practices, war and neighborhood violence, and the limited resources available to children living in poverty. Even children who are fortunate enough to have abundant available resources and who live in relative peace may not be receiving the full benefits of play.⁴
- Playing is essential to development because it contributes to the cognitive, physical, social, and emotional well-being of the children and youth. Playing also serves as the best opportunity for parents to engage fully with their children.⁴
