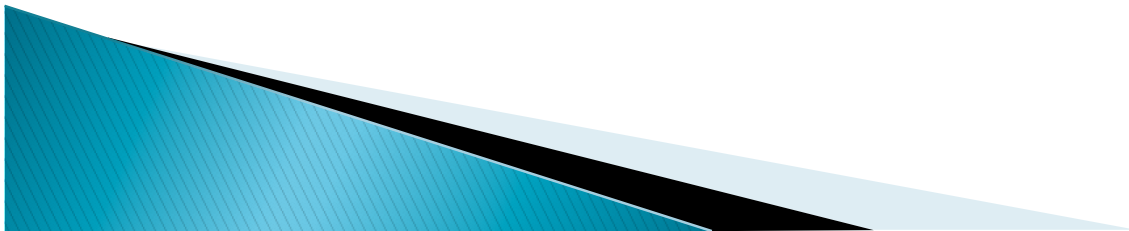




# What is it?

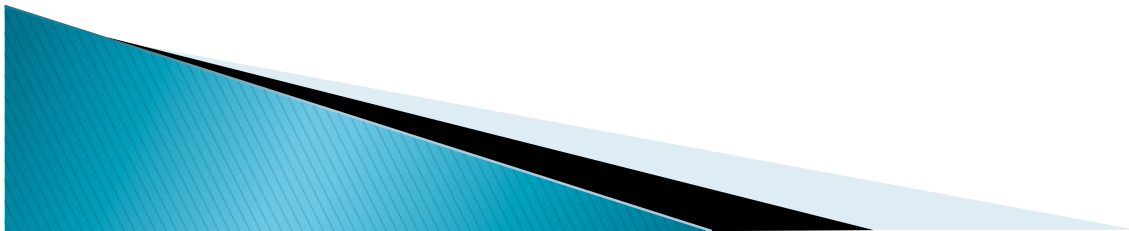


# Necessity

- ▶ Negative or Positive Peace

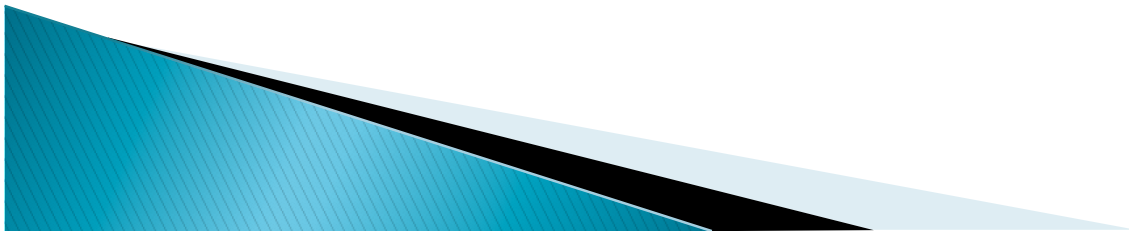

- ▶ Peace is a common language, while we can express it through our traditional cultures.



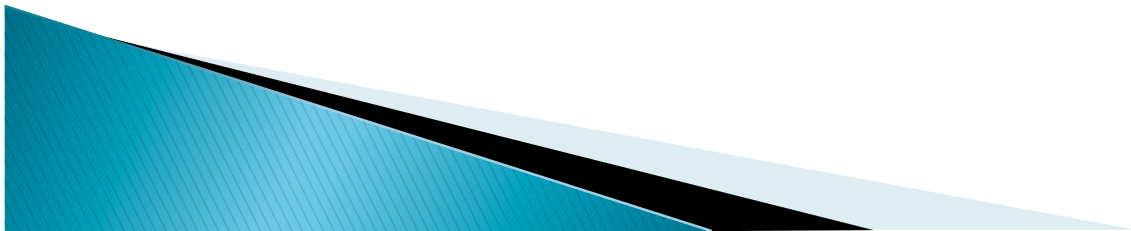
# Feasibility

- ▶ The internet is accessible to almost all people, it is quite convenient for everybody to put proverbs on and express feelings.



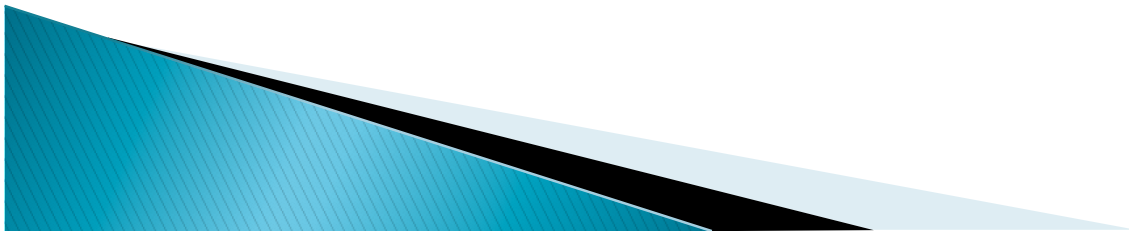
# Objectives

- ▶ Exchanging ideas and sharing individual experiences and feelings with different people all around the world.

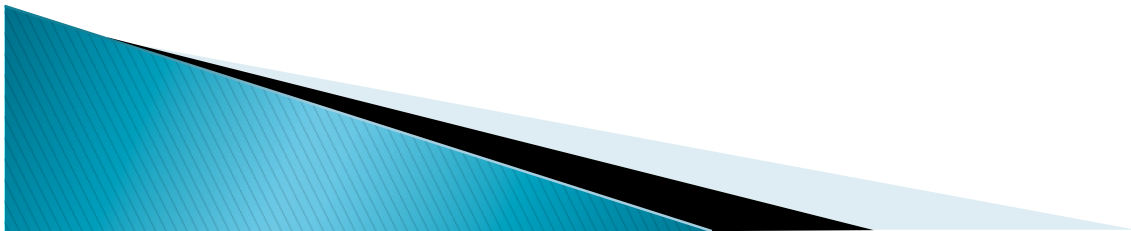


# Functioning
