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# Goals

◆ In global peace café, people who originate from different countries meet and discuss what peace is and how they can achieve peace in local communities, in regions and in the world.

# Participants at global peace café are expected to:

- a) develop inter-disciplinary /-cultural knowledge about peace, exchanging ideas that they contribute;
- b) acquire communication skills to facilitate dialogue and discussion on varying subjects about peace;
- c) foster personal ability to think about peace.

# **Participants**

- Global peace café is a public space where people join freely.
- Door is open. Everybody is welcome.
- Students and citizens, young and old people meet and discuss peace at global peace café.
- Guest speakers from different backgrounds and professions are invited to speak about specialized topics.

## Coordination

- To invite guest speakers from different sectors
- To moderate discussion, combining different methodologies such as:

The art of questioning, socratic dialogue, philosophical consultation... (Philosophy café's method)

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Discussion based on presentations given by guest speakers... (Science café's method)

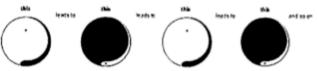
