BACKGROUND

- The 1st **Nepalese Constituent Assembly** was made up of 601 members as a result of the Constituent Assembly election that was held on April 10, 2008 in Nepal.
- The Constituent Assembly declared a republic at its first meeting on May 28, 2008, abolishing the monarchy.
- Due to its failure in drafting a new constitution, the CA was dissolved on May 28th, 2012 after its original and extended total tenure of 4 years.
- The next Nepalese Constituent Assembly elections was held on November 19, 2013.



PROBLEM STATEMENT

- The Constituent Assembly was tasked with writing a new constitution; however, its deadline was extended several times, with the last one set for 27 May 2012.
- In the lead up to the deadline, there were several violent protests & Rallies.
- Prime Minister Baburam Bhattarai called for a new election on 22 November after the deadline passed, with a possibility of a state of emergency.
